- 2 Then fill in an **adverb** to tell us more about *how* the people did the things that they did. You can choose an adverb from the list, or think of one of your own.

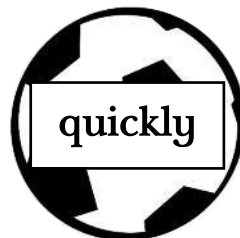
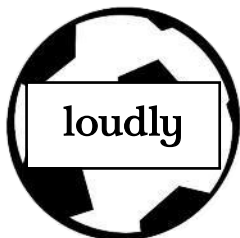

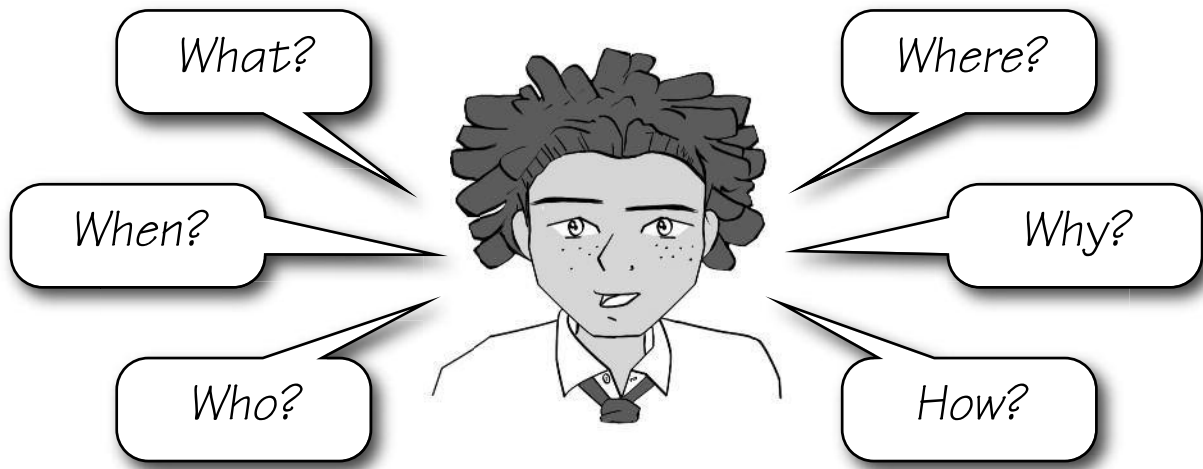
